## “ From the Director ”

Dear Students,

Many congratulations on joining IIT Hyderabad!

Welcome to IIT Hyderabad (IITH). We assure you that you will make lifelong friends, and the time spent at IITH may be the best time of your life.

Established in 2008, IITH has taken huge strides in research and education.

Invention and innovation have been the governing vision for IITH since our motto is “Inventing & Innovating in Technology for Humanity (IITH).” This vision is reflected in all aspects of IITH – teaching, research, startup activities, technology development, campus development, and student activities. Faculty and students of IITH are at the forefront of academic innovation and innovative research. IITH has seen exponential growth in its number of publications, patents, funded projects, and centres of excellence.

There are some more reasons to share and cheer today. Even though it is a fourteen-year-old institute, IITH enjoys being in the top 10 engineering institutions for the 4<sup>th</sup> consecutive year in both NIRF and QS Rankings. IITH also is at 14 and 12 ranks overall and research in 2022. On the Innovation front, IITH has outperformed some first-generation IITs in ARIIA-2021 with a rank of 7.

On the academic front, IITH is surging ahead. We offer BTech programs in 13 Engineering departments, 1 in the Centre for Interdisciplinary Programs (CIP), a BDes in Design, an MSc in Physics, Chemistry and Maths, 2 MA programmes in Liberal Arts, an MDes in Design, and PhD in 17 departments and the CIP. There is a strong emphasis on interdisciplinary academics: for instance, IITH offers a unique BTech program in Engineering Science & Computational Engineering to achieve interdisciplinarity. This year we have started a BTech programme in Electrical Engineering with a specialisation in IC Design & Technology to align with India's goal to



become *Aatma Nirbhar* and a global leader in semiconductor and chip design and manufacturing. IITH allows minors and double majors to its UG students. IITH Students can earn 6 credits through a semester-long internship to industries/academic institutes, both within India and abroad. Our students can take a semester break to work on their innovative ideas and not only earn 6 credits, but also get funding from the institute for such projects under BUILD Projects (BUILD: **B**old and **U**nique **I**deas **L**eading to **D**evelopment). IITH has a department of Entrepreneurship from which a BTech student can get a dual degree in Techno-entrepreneurship.

IITH has a dynamic faculty with a total strength of more than 290, spread over 16 departments. The Institute has MoUs and active collaborations with several leading US, Japanese and Australian universities. We have had several visiting faculty from USA, France, Germany and Canada who taught fractional credit courses. We have active collaboration with industries in India and abroad. We share a special connection with Japan, with Japanese faculty members visiting IITH, teaching courses and participating in research on the one hand. Our students doing their internship at the UG, PG and PhD levels in renowned institutes in Japan.

IITH has several research & academic centres like DST NM-ICPS Technology Innovation Hub on Autonomous Navigation (TiHAN), Design Innovation Center, Center of Excellence (CoE) in Sustainable Development (FAST Center of MoE), Nano-X Fabrication facility, CoE in AI by NVIDIA and KRIYA by JICA, Japan & Honeywell, CoE in Medical Device Innovation, CoE in Transportation Engineering, Rural Development Centre, and Centre for Continuing Education. DRDO has sanctioned a DIA-COE to IITH. IITH has an IP Facilitation Cell to provide IP support, a Tinkerer's lab and E-Cell to promote Innovation and Entrepreneurship among the students.

IITH's zeal for innovation and entrepreneurship is being fulfilled partly through 3 incubators on campus: Centre for Healthcare Entrepreneurship (CfHE), iTIC Incubator, and Fabless Chip (FabCI) Design Incubator, all housed in our Technology Innovation Park, which is spread over 1,50,000 Sqft.

IITH has mentored over 100+ startups which have created about 1000+ jobs and created a revenue of over Rs. 800 Cr.

Student activities are very vibrant on campus, with significant events like the cultural festival 'Elan' and the technology festival 'n-Vision' and clubs such as IITH Racing, Torque, Cepheid, LitSoc, and Dance Club. 'Sunshine,' the peer-counselling group at IITH, supplements professional counselling services to ensure the psychological well-being of our community. The placements at IITH have always been excellent. Japanese Industries regularly recruit students, which is a unique feature of IITH. Industries have

recognised that we impart quality education and produce outstanding human resources that can be valuable contributors to their organisational growth.

IITH has a unique holistic educational ecosystem that promotes cutting-edge research, learning and entrepreneurs. It provides an environment wherein students and faculty are not afraid to experiment. I am confident that your stay at IITH will be educative, productive and memorable. IITH will do its best to offer an innovative & encouraging environment wherein your dreams of higher knowledge, scientific inquiry, technology creation, and excellence as a citizen & human being can be realised.

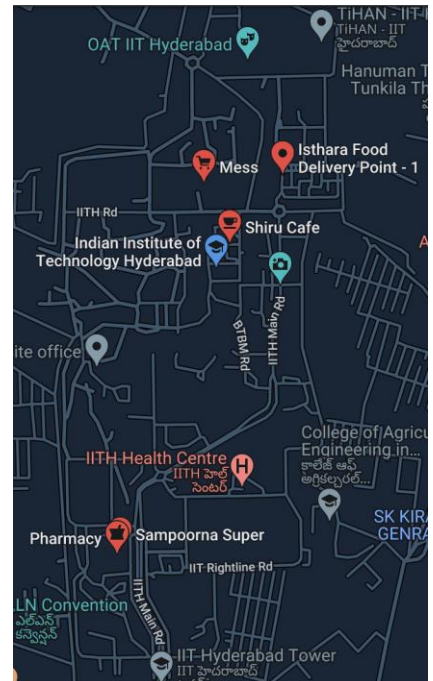
## Campus Amenities at a Glance

## Food

So What can a student expect in terms of food at IIT Hyderabad? Quite a lot.

### Hostel Mess and Canteens:

Breakfast, lunch, evening tea, coffee with snacks, and dinner are served daily in the spacious dining hall next to the hostels. The food is prepared in state-of-the-art hygienic kitchens and serves home-style, primarily Indian food. The food can be a bit spicy (we are in Telangana, after all!), but low-spice alternatives are usually included in the fare. Both vegetarian and non-vegetarian foods are available.



When you feel like trying something besides mess food, you don't have to go far! Baked food, soft drinks, fruit juices, and vegetarian and non-vegetarian street food can be bought from shops just a minute's walk from the hostel buildings. Chinese, chat and Punjabi food are some options offered by this modest but surprisingly well-stocked group of shops.

### Isthara Food Court:

The Isthara Food Court (pictured below) was inaugurated in 2021 in the Research Park and consisted of the following outlets:

All these outlets work 24X7 to provide the IITH community with quality food. They also provide a delivery service where you can order from anywhere on campus. Students can visit the food court any time from 12 PM to 2 AM. For additional services, students can visit the nearby city of Sangareddy, which is a 10-minute drive from campus. Sangareddy has decent hotels and restaurants, shopping complexes and chain stores



like Reliance Fresh, More, KFC, Reliance Trends, Ezee Buy, etc.

Shirucafe, a Japanese franchise, has an outlet in Academic Block C and offers free gourmet coffee and juices to keep you fueled between classes; you'll need to order online and pick up your drink at the café. Sangareddy, Kandi and Isnapur—all 10-minute drives from the IITH campus—have respectable eateries. Still, for the real foodies, nothing is as good as taking a 1-hour ride to Hyderabad city and getting a taste of classic Hyderabadi cuisine. Biryani from the famous Paradise Hotel in Secunderabad (a branch recently opened in Muthangi and Lingampally) might be worth trying out. Still, the Charminar area has several little eateries with super-authentic Hyderabadi food.



## IITH Medical facility

---



For general health care, a 24x7 medical clinic, together with a 24/7 Apollo Pharmacy, is located on the campus. The CMO-In-Charge heads the clinic with a team of full-time Medical Officers, Physiotherapists, Visiting Specialists and Nursing staff. The medical needs of the campus population consisting of students, staff members and their families are met by the institute clinic.

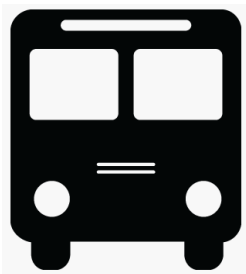
Further, specialist doctors visit the campus on select days.

## Transport



The permanent campus is on the Mumbai highway and is located about an hour's drive from the airport. There are regular buses to and from Patancheru (the key hub to get transport to all other locations in Hyderabad/Secunderabad) which stop on request in front of the permanent campus gate. Ola Cabs and several other private operators provide taxi services to and from the Kandi campus.

### Internal Transport:

IITH provides internal transport services between the Main Gate and the Hostel Circle and between the Hostel Circle and the New Hostels. Currently, the Institute runs 4 electric vehicles which connect the Hostel Circle and the New Hostels and 3 buses which connect the Main Gate and the Hostel Circle. ### External Transport:

A weekend service to Miyapur (Faculty/Staff/students): A 40-seater bus is available on Saturday and Sunday to Miyapur, a prime shopping centre and terminus of the Hyderabad Metro Rail. The bus starts from campus at 10 AM, and they will return at 10 PM from Miyapur. A ticket fare of Rs 100 will be charged for one-way travel. There is an additional bus service (on working days only) from Miyapur Metro Station to IITH that starts from Miyapur at 07:30 AM and returns from IITH at 05:45 PM; students, staff and faculty can use this service on a monthly subscription basis.

Public buses to almost every part of the city can be accessed from Patancheru, a major bus depot about 15-20 km from campus. Public buses are coming from and going towards Patancheru every 10 minutes; they will stop at the campus entrance on request. The Hyderabad Metro Rail can be accessed from Miyapur, about an hour's drive from campus. The MMTS (local train network) services the Lingampally station, which is around 45 minutes from campus. Passenger trains can be accessed from the Shankarpally station nearby. The Rajiv Gandhi International Airport is about an hour away; you can hire local cabs to get there.

Undergraduate students are not allowed to bring their vehicles to campus.

# ACADEMICS AT IIT HYDERABAD



IIT Hyderabad is committed to nurturing academic excellence in an environment that promotes intellectual freedom and curiosity. The curriculum enables students not only to acquire professional knowledge but also to prepare them for high-quality research and interdisciplinary engagements.

IITH follows a unique academic program we call fractal academics to allow students to choose exciting courses across departments and to tailor their coursework according to their specific academic and career goals. The courses are atomised into fragments of 0.5, 1 and 2 credits. Honours Degrees are awarded to students for extra academic effort. IITH offers many Minor Programs. You can also obtain a Double Major by taking a specific number of courses from two separate departments. All students are assigned faculty advisors to guide them in academic matters.

The 290 (and counting!) brilliant and dedicated faculty members at IITH are deeply committed to quality education and research. They have been instrumental in

establishing several state-of-the-art laboratories at IITH and conducting world-class research. We are proud to say that IITH is ranked 9<sup>th</sup> among engineering colleges in India (NIRF, which is a considerable achievement for such a young Institute).

## Grading System and Examinations

.....



IITH adopts a Credit System to fulfil the requirements for receiving the degrees. Students must earn credits by registering for courses; sometimes, even project work may be taken for credit. A 1-credit course involves 14-15 hours of classes, which are usually spread over five weeks. There are compulsory theory and practice courses for each specialisation in addition to elective courses. Students become eligible for the degree on completing the minimum required credits in each area. The grading in IITH is relative and is based on the Instructor's perception of what an average performance is. At the end of the course, based on continual evaluation throughout the course (in the form of assignments, pop quizzes and examinations), a student is given one of eight passing letter grades, namely, A+, A, A-, B, B-, C, C-, and D carrying credit points of 10, 10, 9, 8, 7, 6, 5, and 4, respectively, or fail (F) grade carrying zero credit points. Upon obtaining any of the above pass grades, the student is deemed to 'earn' those course credits. If a student gets a Fail (F) grade, no credits are earned for that course. Supplementary exams will be conducted for medical cases only. To avail of this, the student must submit the medical certificate at the time of joining the institute after the medical break.

### **Creative Arts**

IIT Hyderabad is unique among IITs for integrating the Fine Arts and Performing Arts

Every semester, the Creative Arts Programme offers a variety of 1-credit courses on the visual arts, music, dance, creative writing, and theatre. Students learn from artists who have made significant contributions to their fields. Since these courses are offered by practising artists



with very busy schedules, Creative Arts (CA for short) courses do not follow the regular IIT timetable. Still, they are conducted outside of class hours (mostly at weekends and evenings) according to the convenience of the artists. You can register for these courses online through the common registration portal, but if you are keen on taking a particular course, make sure you register early: some of these courses have relatively low intakes to ensure that students get enough time to interact with the artists.

## Guest Lectures

IIT Hyderabad regularly invites distinguished academics and industry leaders to deliver public lectures to the campus community. Various departments also conduct their own discipline-specific lecture series. The Student Gymkhana also organises extramural lectures by celebrities in various fields.

## Office of Career Services (OCS)

.....



The Office of Career Services (OCS) plays a vital role in shaping students' careers at the Institute. The Office facilitates internship and placement activities for the young and talented students at IITH. It organises and coordinates the campus placement drive every year.

The office works as a liaison between the various industries/corporates/startups and the students of IITH. More than 200 companies participate in the placement every year.

In addition to campus placements, the career cell of OCS regularly organises professional development programs like mock interviews, group discussions, industrial expert talks, career planning etc. This is to expose students to various career opportunities after their stay at IITH, including the core sector, IT sector, startups, higher studies, and other unconventional career choices.

The OCS@IITH is a predominantly student-driven activity (200+ student volunteers) with full-time support from dedicated OCS staff and the Faculty in-Charge OCS.

## Green Office



The Green Office at IIT Hyderabad encourages people to "Reduce, Reuse, Recycle and Turn-Off". Its team consists of students, faculty and staff of IITH. The green office is organised into four committees - Campus Biodiversity, Solid Waste Management, Energy Conservation and Outreach. These committees are coordinated by a faculty member who serves as Convener for the Green Office. It implements activities that will contribute towards eco-friendly and sustainable practices on the IITH campus. Getting involved with this body offers an excellent opportunity to make a difference in the IITH community and to prepare for a deeper engagement with the world at large.

Activities implemented up to now include

- A campus recycling program covering paper, plastic, packing material, scrap metal, and hazardous e-waste. Separate bins have been installed for this purpose.
- A bike program has been implemented by which rent-free bicycles are available on a short-term basis for commuting within the campus.
- A white paper containing a list of indigenous tree species suitable for plantation in IITH main campus has been prepared
- An inventory of all equipment (water and electricity-consuming devices) has been created
- An on-campus snake rescue program, for the relocation of snakes, in cooperation with the Friends of Snakes Society, has been established
- Posters with energy-saving tips in all offices and labs of IITH have been put up

A recycling program was initiated on campus by Prakriti, Nature Club in fiscal 2012-2013; the Green Office is now continuing this program. The recycling program resulted in a significant reduction in our impact on the environment. Further, the recyclable material was sold to a vendor, selected using open tender, and the money was deposited in the IITH account.

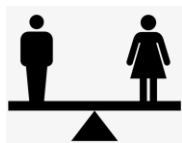

## Extracurricular Activities

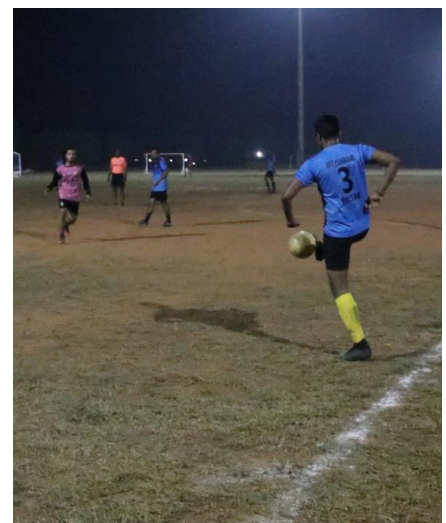

## National Service Scheme

National Service Scheme (NSS) is a service program which aims to inculcate principles of social commitment in students and to provide service to society without bias. Many students actively volunteer for the events organised by NSS, IITH. One of the many main events we organise is Swachh Bharat where our volunteers get to contribute to the cleanliness of the campus by picking up waste and non-biodegradable waste in their surroundings. Another main event which happens under NSS is Vidyadaan. This gives our volunteers the opportunity to share their knowledge with school children in nearby government schools. Some of the other events include the donation of books and clothes to poor students; visiting slums, orphanages, old-age homes, and nearby villages; organising various awareness camps (like the campaign to increase awareness about the importance of sanitation); blood donation camps; plantation drives; watering of plants; cleanliness events (like Clean India Drive, Tidy Room) etc. In addition, various online events with different themes are conducted involving case studies, poster making, video making etc. It is mandatory for every undergraduate at IITH to take part either in a sports activity (NSO) or in the NSS program and to finish the required criteria before graduation.
